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**, Bid for Accident and Health Insurance  
Coverage of Plan**

- 1) **Period of Insurance:** November 24, 2021 – June 7, 2022
- 2) **Type of Insurance:** Accident and Health
- 3) **Coverage:**
  - Medical – PHP 50,000 / person
  - Accidental (Death) – PHP 100,000 / person
  - Admission – Regular private when infection control is needed
  - Including – Inpatient/Outpatient, Emergency, Preventive, Consultation
- 4) **Number of Insured Persons:** Around 300\*
- 5) **Requisite Benefit:**
  - No-cash-out at the accredited hospitals
  - Affiliated DOH clinics in all provinces of the Philippines.
  - Reimbursement on non-accredited clinics
  - The accredited hospitals must include the following hospitals:

\*Insured persons are the candidates who take the Japanese-language training at PAD, and the other facilities before they are dispatched to Japan to work as nurses and caregivers under the Japan-Philippines Economic Partnership Agreement (JPEPA).
