Bid for Accident and Health Insurance Coverage of Plan

- 1) **Period of Insurance:** November 5, 2024 – May 22, 2025
- 2) **Type of Insurance:** Accident and Health
- 3) **Coverage:**
 - Medical – PHP 50,000 / person
 - Accidental (Death) – PHP 100,000 / person
 - Admission – Regular private if infection control is needed
 - Including – Inpatient/Outpatient, Emergency, Preventive, Consultation, Covid-19 related coverage.
- 4) **Number of Insured Persons:** Around 290
- 5) **Requisite Benefit:**
 - No-cash-out at the accredited hospitals
 - Affiliated DOH clinics in all provinces of the Philippines.
 - Reimbursement on non-accredited clinics
 - The accredited hospitals must include the following hospitals:

 - The accredited hospitals should also be on the latest list of "Accredited Medical Facility for Overseas Workers and Seafarers" that the Department of Health of the Philippine government commended.
 - Excluding coverage for annual physical examination
 - Willing to conduct an online-orientation for the members.

*Insured persons are the candidates who take the Japanese-language training, before they are dispatched to Japan to work as nurses and caregivers under the Japan-Philippines Economic Partnership Agreement (JPEPA).
